Interpretive, guided "Bushmen Walks" are led by experienced guides who hail from the San Bushmen clans of the area and thus with their extensive knowledge, provide insights into their traditional lifestyle through dress, activities and a short walk. The dedicated walk is both awe inspiring and humbling, as you thread along paths animals roam free on. It is the perfect setting for the guest along with their friends and loved ones to appreciate the natural environment. the slow pace of the walk allows for the the interpretative skills of the guides to open your eyes to a new and fascinating world.

The San share their intimate knowledge with guests, showing how to survive in the harsh environment of the Kalahari Desert by teaching which plants are safe to eat and which contain water, useful knowledge to thrive for so long in this demanding landscape. This walking safari is unique in Africa and many people travel to the Kalahari regions of Botswana just to participate in this experience.

The Mokoro Excursion ...

Khwai

The mokoro excursion is a highly popular activity for Moremi and Khwai among guests who travel to Botswana. It is an opportunity to completely experience the sounds and sights of nature without running the risk of frightening off animals with a motor and is therefore a highly recommended expedition for photographers. Guides that command the mokoro are highly knowledgeable about the natural environment making these trips safe and enjoyable.

Some guests have described a mokoro trip as one of the most peaceful experiences they have had. Imagine gliding through water ways created by hippos that mirrors the sky above, brushing past tall reeds which are home to a variety of tiny brightly coloured painted reed frogs, and approaching an Elephant - ear deep in the water happily cooling off.








The Rock Paintings ...

Savuti



Come explore the vast and wonderful landscape of Savuti with an experienced guide opening your eyes to the wonder of the San bushman who marked their stories in the form of awe inspiring rock paintings.

Guests are permitted to get out and manoeuvre the little way up the rocky hills to view the artworks, found on the South-east cliffs overlooking the Savuti channel. Guests can also marvel at the historic baobabs in the area and look out for the seldom seen klipspringer antelope. Overlooking the arid river channel of Savuti, which today is only flooded by the high water of the Zambezi when flooding, you will find these excellent paintings on the walls of an "abri", a typical spot to stay for the hunter/gatherers. The paintings, although not carbon dated, are estimated rot be between 3000 to 4000 years old

The Chobe River Cruise

Chobe National Park is well-known for its large herds of elephant that frequent the Chobe River on a daily basis. In the dry season an estimate of up to 85,000 elephants can be dispersed within the Chobe National Park, where the majority of them can be found along the river.

What better way to witness the largest natural roaming population of wild elephants than on a river cruise enjoying a cold beverage under the beautiful African sun. Other wonderful sightings include the likes of The lion, leopard, buffalo and a whole host of antelope like sable, the seldom seen puku, kudu, eland, roan and many others. The river is filled with big pods of hippos and some of the biggest crocodiles in Africa.




Victoria Falls Day Trip...

Zimbabwe







Victoria Falls presents a spectacular sight of awe-inspiring beauty and grandeur on the Zambezi River, forming the boarder between Zambia and Zimbabwe.

Columns of spray can be seen miles away. At the height of the rainy season, more than five hundred million cubic meters of water per minute plummet over the edge of a rocky waterfall. This is covered over a width of two kilometres, into a gorge over one hundred meters below.

It was described by the Kololo tribe as "The Smoke thats Thunders". In more modern terms, Victoria Falls is knows as the greatest curtain of falling water in the world. A spectacular sight that will take your breath away as you explore the different view points, following a path from the forested head of the fall to the open areas where you can appreciate the water crashing on the open cliffs.



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
